Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, November always begins with a very special day on the church calendar.



Nov. 1 is All Saints Day. On this day the church remembers and honors all the Christian faithful, both known and unknown, living and passed on to glory.

The word "saint" comes from the Latin "sanctus" which means "holy."

Many churches, our own included, celebrate this festival on the first Sunday in November; this year, we will observe All Saints Sunday on Nov. 6.

This is a time to remember faithful men and women. We remember and thank God for the examples we receive through Scripture, both the Old and New Testaments. We remember the stories of faithful Christians throughout the church's 2,000-year history, some well known (like Martin Luther, Charles Wesley, Mother Theresa), and others known only to God.

In many congregations, including ours, we memorialize those in our church who have died in the past year, and are now in God's embrace. As we worship we are invited to remember all loved ones,

friends, and mentors now living in God's realm, whose faith inspired us and brought us joy.

The church has traditionally been the final resting place of deceased members of the Christian community, and burial in the adjacent churchyard was once common practice. It was a gift to families and friends to have the opportunity to "remember the saints of God" as they came to visit the graves of loved ones.

Today it is difficult for churches to carry on that practice. In recent years, cremation with interment of the ashes, rather than burial, has become more common. In this way, the remains of the deceased can stay on at the church that played such an important part in their lives. This is made possible by the construction of a columbarium, which consists of a group of niches within a stone wall, which contain the cremated remains of the departed.

Baker Memorial UMC is blessed to have a group of committed laity who advocated for the establishment of a columbarium here at our church. On Sept. 26, 2010, we made the decision to move forward, a committee was established, and over the next months steps were taken to build a columbarium on our church grounds. We are grateful for the hours of work and donations of talents

Come on Nov. 5 to Hear, Discuss Changes in Sunday School

All kids are rightly called children of God, but not all kids learn the exact same way. Some learn best if they can listen to a lesson, some need to read it themselves. Others learn best if they connect a story to something they've done with their hands, and still others need to "run it through their bodies" in a game, or sport, or dance. Because we have all sorts of kids in our congregation here at Baker, our Christian Education committee has begun to ask whether we could better meet their diverse needs in our Sunday School program. In conjunction with the awarding of the Scientists in Congregations grant, we are exploring the Workshop Rotation Model,

The Workshop Rotation Model is a kid-friendly, teacher-encouraging and facility transforming way to teach Bible stories and Christian faith. Teachers stay put for four- to 6-week tours of duty in the workshop medium of their choice – teaching nearly the same lesson each week (with some age-appropriate adjustments) to different classes which rotate through. Classes rotate into a different workshop each week but stay with the same story for four to six weeks, learning it in-depth through a variety of media without getting bored. Rooms become transformed by the learning activity they host. Model "workshops" transform beige and boring

classroom spaces into a blizzard of creative, kid-friendly design. These multimedia workshops can become a well stocked Art Room, a Movie Studio to make and view video, a Science Lab, a Puppet Theater, a Drama stage complete with costumes and props.

Everyone is welcome to come share ideas, ask questions and hear more about this model at our Nov. 5 gathering. An idea like this will need the enthusiastic support of many church members ... there is a place for all. Give us the opportunity to make you an enthusiastic supporter!

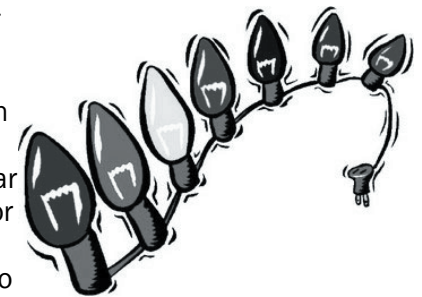

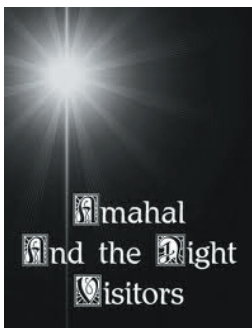
toasty while you watch the fun, United Methodist Women will, as always, be selling hot chocolate and popcorn. Enjoy this wonderful start to the Christmas season.

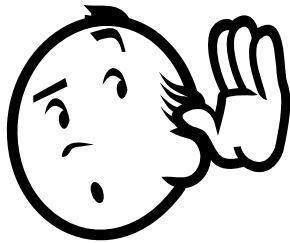

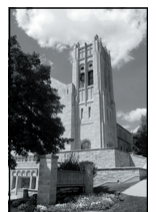
Lazarus House Help Needed

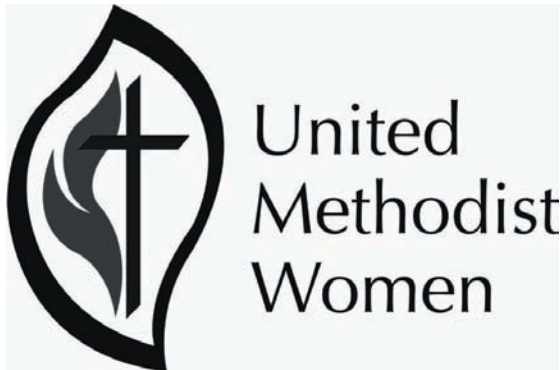

Tri-City Unemployment Group (TUG) is an ongoing volunteer-based program formed in October 2001 to address the needs of the unemployed and under employed in the Tri-Cities area. Meetings are at 6:30 p.m. on the second and fourth Mondays of the month at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, 1145 N. Fifth Ave., St. Charles. The first part of each gathering is a general presentation on a topic related to the job search process, such as dealing with personal and family stress, resume writing, interviewing skills, financial management, career skills assessment and networking. The second half provides an opportunity for direct networking and interpersonal support. Individual assistance and guidance is provided, one-on-one. More than 8,500 residents throughout the Tri-City and surrounding areas have sought out TUG services. TUG services are free to all who attend. Consider yourself welcome to join in whether you are unemployed, underemployed or want to enhance your networking opportunities.

and money so generously provided by church members.

The columbarium was consecrated on Sunday, October 16. It is outside, against a church wall visible from the church courtyard. We rejoice in God's leading which has made this possible.

The columbarium has 54 niches, and currently six of them have been sold. Each niche can accommodate two urns. The cost for a niche containing one urn is \$1,200 and the cost for a niche that will contain two urns is \$1,700. This cost is the total required and covers interment, the urn(s), engraving plus upkeep of the grounds.

Anyone interested should contact either myself, or Peter Vargulich, the chair of the Columbarium Committee. We are blessed to be able to provide a place of remembrance where departed loved ones can be honored and remembered. The columbarium offers a consoling link between life and death, as we hold in our hearts the proclamation of the church: Life is eternal; have no fear.
