PASTOR MARY'S MESSAGE

By Name...

But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. —Isaiah 43:1 (NRSV)

I have always appreciated this verse for what it tells us about the character of God. It's written to the small remnant of ancient Israelites who still seek to know God although they are exiled in Babylon. They are not a very impressive crowd. They have been carried away from their homeland and oppressed as a conquered people. They have no power and few belongings. They are strangers in a strange land. Yet, they are loved by God. The Almighty God knows them each by their name!

The passage later opens up to include all people who bear the name of God. That means that God knows our names as well. There may be 100 million people alive today who are named "Mary" in whatever form the name takes in their native language. Yet somehow God knows us apart and knows each of us by name. We are not lost in the crowd of humanity. We are not strangers to God. We are each a loved one. How wonderful and comforting that is.

Having moved to a new town a few times now, I also know how important it is to have other people know your name. The first time someone calls out to you by name when you're around town, it means a lot. Hearing your name tells you that you matter. It's a sign that you are beginning to belong. It's a sign of friendship. Home is where you are known by name.

So imagine visiting a church, and not even being asked what your name is. Imagine returning for weeks on end and never being recognized. That church can never feel like home enough to join.

An important part of our work as a church is getting to know each other by name, especially on the first few visits. I know it can be difficult these days. There's a fear that you will ask for someone's name only to discover that they have been attending for years and already know your name well. There are ways to address that fear. **First**, everyone who is a member should wear their name tag. That tells us that you are committed to this church

as your family and helps us know each other without embarrassment. **Second**, you can always say, "I'm sorry I don't remember your name" when you approach someone.

If they've been around for years, they'll probably just realize that they are not the only ones who struggle with

names. **Third**, get to know something more than a person's name. Engage them in conversation about where they live,

whether they work and what they do, if they have children, and maybe even if their name is a certain nationality.

Trying to just keep names and faces together is difficult, it helps to fill in a little more information to make a more complete memory so you can put the right name with the right person. **Fourth**, use their name several times in the

conversation. It may be awkward at first, but the more times you say the name out loud the more likely you are to remember them. **Fifth**, commit to watch for them to return over the next few weeks and tell them you are going to do that. How nice to think that you might be recognized when you come back! **Finally**, write the name down on a piece of paper with a little description and put it in the offering plate or hand it to me. It will help you remember when you write it down, and it will help the staff be on the look-out to welcome a return visitor by name as well.

It really can't be stressed enough, being known by name is a part of belonging whether that be to God or to God's Church. We are blessed with many visitors to this congregation. An important part of our ministry together is to work on getting to know people by name. Don't count on someone else doing it. This is a part of reflecting the image of God in the church. It is everyone's work.

FOCUS: SPENDING TIME WITH GOD

► **Family Bible Verse:** *Come near to God, and he will come near to you.* —James 4:8a (Deep Blue Kid's Bible CEB)

I have to admit that I am excited my children are back in school and have a routine, a schedule, and more discipline. All summer my family has been practicing better habits through consistent routines and positive attitudes. I said it and I will say it again, "A better attitude means a better you." Every once in a while I hear a brilliant saying and quickly jot it down on my phone. I love this one from my daughter Teagan, "Change your color; change your mood." However, sometimes you need more than neon yellow to change your mood.

First, we had to find a time of day and a place for our family to have "quiet time" with God. For us, it was best right before bed time. We tried a few parts of the house, but ultimately the living room won. After a few weeks, it was great to see everyone coming together to end the day as a family with prayers of joys and concerns. We are a very busy family, and some nights we had a one-on-one with God or prayers over the phone.

We choose to use the *Veggie Tales God Made Me Special 365 Daily Devos for Girls*. The secret to our success was not reading this devotion in order, but to find the topic we needed to hear in that moment. To be absolutely honest, some nights we needed to hear more than one. I treasure these quiet times coming together to pray as a family.

Our nightly devotionals helped us to focus on spending consistent time with God. It also taught us how to be more obedient and to forgive. We had to do this through listening to each other and to God's word.

We continue to look for ways to spend more time with God. Teagan and I go on scooter rides/runs around our neighborhood to see God's glory work in gardens (she scooters as I run.) We will continue to listen to a Christian music channel like Moody and soon we will be adding journaling into our daily routines.


2018 Church Directory Update

Sharing Food and Fellowship

A couple of years ago I took up serious grilling.

It was time to graduate from burgers and brats to whole chickens and turkeys, pulled pork and, yes (oh, yes), Texas brisket.

A chicken is easy, and pulled pork is, too, although it can take more than half a day. But brisket is another thing. Low and slow, consistent temperature, unpredictability and your friends' expectations. Brisket makes me nervous.

I start preparing a packer brisket two days in advance. Once the meat is on the grill—indirect, of course—the waiting begins. I watch the thermometer as the muscle's internal temperature slowly rises, then stalls around 160 degrees while the collagens and tough tissues begin to break down and evaporate.

By the time the brisket is ready to eat, hungry friends have arrived and I'm a nervous wreck, every time, despite the fact that I'm yet to smoke a bad anything. It took me a while to understand why this is so.

What I like best about grilling is sharing it with my friends, the sense of community around the table as we indulge together in a meal. Food is always more meaningful when shared with others. Jesus thought of this whenever he broke bread. His final hours with his

disciples were spent eating a meal.

It is because of this sense of community that Baker Memorial United Methodist Church serves food—albeit cookies and doughnuts, not brisket—during fellowship time between worship services.


For many years, the church's various groups and committees provided the food each Sunday. We hope to implement a new fellowship time food plan in January 2020.


