PASTOR MARY'S MESSAGE

Perseverance

I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus. —Philippians 3:14 (NIV)

The Olympic Games are in full swing as I write this article. The athletes have trained hard, listened to their coaches, and persevered through all kinds of troubles and trials. They are at the top level of their sport, in part because of their athletic and artistic gifts. However, the real reason almost any of them are so good, is their focus and perseverance. When they did not want to get up early to train, they got up early and trained anyway. When they fell down, they got up and tried again. When they needed to learn something new, they tried again and again until what was once awkward and dangerous, became natural to do and beautiful to watch. When other sports, academic, or social activities looked attractive, they still focused on the sport they had chosen to excel in. When their coaches showed them more effective approaches, they listened and followed their advice. Olympic athletes understand what it means to persevere.

This image of sports achievement is in view as Paul writes his letter to the Philippians. Perhaps this letter was even written during an Olympic year. The ancient games were run every four years in Olympia, Greece from the 8th century B.C.E. to the 4th century C.E. People understood what perseverance in sports looked like then, just as we do now. That's what makes the "games" an effective metaphor for what it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ.

Following Jesus and growing in faith requires commitment and perseverance. In order to be more than a spectator watching others experience grace, find joy in service, and face the trials of life with peace that passes understanding, we will need to make choices. We will need to worship, study scripture, and pray when we prefer to be entertained. We will need to serve others, and stretch ourselves to generosity even when we suffer from compassion fatigue. We will need to learn to do things that initially feel awkward, whether

that be leading missions work, teaching children, or seeking answers to the questions we have been taught were not acceptable to ask. Being a Christian requires perseverance, not for a season but for the whole of life.

Eugene Peterson wrote a beautiful book titled, *A Long Obedience in the Same Direction; Discipleship in an Instant Society*. I am struck but what he says in the opening sentences of the first chapter,

One aspect of world that I have been able to identify as harmful to Christians is the assumption that anything worthwhile can be acquired at once. We assume that if something can be done at all, it can be done quickly and efficiently. Our attention spans have been conditioned by thirty-second commercials. Our sense of reality has been flattened by thirty-page abridgments. It is not difficult in such a world to get a person interested in the message of the gospel; it is terrifically difficult to sustain the interest.

Peterson wrote those words in 1988, and kept them in the 2002 version of this now classic book. I think the words still

apply well today, although it has arguably become harder to get people interested in the message of the Gospel. Our culture is now not only instantaneous but also customized to the interests we already have. Even so, once someone is interested and open, the very next hurdle is sustained interest and practice.

Paul's letter to the Philippians and Peterson's book both remind us that perseverance is a key part of growing in faith. It's something for us to ponder as we approach the middle of Lent and any disciplines we have individually chosen to practice grow weary. It's something for us to remember every day as we choose how to spend our time and our energy. It's something for us to remember as we work together as a congregation to grow in faithfulness and in number. We will try some things that feel awkward, and do some things that are not successful. So long as we are convinced that we are heading in God's direction, the answer is not to stop trying, but rather to persevere in our long obedience to God's direction.





PASSOVER SEDER MEAL

Scripture tells us that we "shall observe the festival of unleavened bread, for on this very day I brought your companies out of the land of Egypt; you shall observe this day throughout your generations as a perpetual ordinance."—Exodus 12:17. Our Maundy Thursday service this year is a combined Seder Meal and Holy Communion service, which will be held on Thursday, March 29, at 6pm in Wiley Hall.

Our whole church family is welcome to attend. Parents are especially encouraged to bring children, as a Seder is a meal for the whole family (Exodus 12:24). The service will begin with our church family sharing a Passover Seder, which is a liturgical meal with a history of more than 3,000 years. It is a participatory retelling of the story of Passover, with sights, sounds, smells, tastes, and textures; it will include a full supper. The service will conclude with the sacrament of Holy Communion, which was instituted by Jesus at a Seder he shared with his disciples. It will begin promptly at 6pm, and conclude no later than 8pm.

The cost is \$10 per adult and \$5 per child (5-12); children 5 and under are free. Register and pay by one of the following methods:



UMW READING PROGRAM: BOOK ONE REVIEW

Are there not enough hours in your day to accomplish everything that needs to be done? Are you one who says “Read a book! I don’t have time to read a book, even though I would like to.” Well, maybe this will help you be up-to-date with the subjects and concerns that the UMW Reading Program would like you to be. In the coming months, there will be a synopsis or condensed version of a UMW Reading Program books for you to read. This may help you in deciding to read the book in its entirety or to



place your name on the waiting list for check out. For starters, the first book is *Without You, There Is No Us* by Suki Kim

This is a haunting memoir of Suki Kim teaching English to the sons of North Korea’s ruling class (270 students) during the last six months of Kim Jong-il’s reign. The year is 2011. Life at this all male

Pyeongyang University of Science and Technology (PUST) is a walled compound where portraits of Kim il-Sung and Kim Jong-il are on the walls of every room. It is a prison disguised as a campus.

Every day, three times a day, the students march in two straight lines, singing praises to Kim Jong-il and North

Korea: “Without you, there is no motherland. Without you, there is no us.” Of course, to the students, the “you” implies Kim Jong-il.

Suki carefully plans her lessons in order to expose her students to tidbits of information about life outside North Korea, especially technology and the internet.

The curriculum at PUST was restricted not only by the government, but by the religious values of the missionaries. Somehow, she managed to allow them to watch Harry Potter!

They go on a trip to an apple farm which appears to be an idyllic rural landscape, but she is horrified to discover that the workers are stunted and emaciated.


The students believe that the Korean language is superior and universal. Yet their government allows, even encourages, English-language instruction for its top students.

After the death of King Jong il, some in the West speculated that North Korea would be alleviated from dictatorship. But, Suki’s students condemn the U.S. and South Korea in their *juche* training.

Should we be hopeful about North Korea’s future and is it possible for the international community to help bring to an end the suffering of the North Korean people? (This is very timely for us to read.) To learn more, visit www.SukiKim.com —*Barb Traver*
